## Points of Interest

- A. **Fort McCoy** - A U.S. Army installation which has been serving America's Army since 1909. Tours available.
- B. **Wegner Grotto** - Folk art display of glass and pottery shards in concrete dates to the 1930s.
- C. **Deke Slayton Memorial Space & Bike Museum** - A tribute to the life and career of Astronaut Deke Slayton. An educational adventure into space flight history and the significance of bicycling.
- D. **St. Mary's Ridge Church** - Over 100 years old, this church is located at the highest point of St. Mary's Ridge.
- E. **Kendall Railroad Depot** - Headquarters for the Elroy-Sparta Bike Trail.
- F. **La Crosse River** - Begin a canoeing or kayaking adventure near Sparta.
- G. **Monroe County Courthouse** - Romanesque Revival architecture in red sandstone. Built in 1896.
- H. **Little Red School House** - Delightfully preserved one room school built in 1854. Open during summer; free admission.
- I. **Little Falls Railroad & Doll Museum, Ltd.** - Wisconsin Heritage site #263. Extensive railroad displays and art; Large doll museum with gift shop; outdoor garden railroad with picnic/play area.
- J. **Cranberry Museum & Gift Shop** - Museum dedicated to heritage of the cranberry industry. Gift shop and ice-cream treats.
- K. **McMullen County Park** - 600 acres of forest, including a 30-acre cranberry flowage. Camping sites, hiking trails and fishing.
- L. **Kickapoo River** - Many canoeists regard this meandering river as the best in southern Wisconsin.
- M. **Amish Country** - Relax and enjoy a drive through Amish Country. The Amish began to settle in this area in 1966, and have rapidly grown in population in the midst of modern life.
- N. **Tomah Area Historical Society Museum** - Located in the heart of downtown Tomah, it displays history of native son Frank King and "Gasoline Alley".
- O. **M&M Ranch** - Exotic animals; tours available.
- P. **Access to Wildcat Mountain State Park**
- Q. **Cranberry Country** - Cranberries play an important role in the local and state economy. Locally, our berries account for more than one third of Wisconsin's estimated cranberry market.
- R. **Access to Black River State Forest**
- S. **Down a Country Road (Cashton)** - Amish education and settlement tours.
- T. **Sparta Depot** - Headquarters for the La Crosse River State Park Trail and west of the Elroy-Sparta Bike Trail.
